To go **online**, you will need a **device** and a way to connect to the internet.

Going online means using a device to look at the internet, send emails or talk to other people.



A device is a computer, a laptop, a tablet or a mobile phone.



A device and an internet connection cost money and you may need to check if you have enough money to pay for them.



The internet is usually a cost each month but see more below.

Free internet



Some libraries and coffee shops give people free access to the internet. This is called public **wifi**.

Wifi is a way to connect to the internet.



The library or shop will give users a password to go online for free.



Free wifi is not always secure so you should not use it for banking or buying things online.

Internet you pay for



If you are not able to find a place with free wifi, you will need to buy a **broadband** connection, or package.

Broadband is the way your device can connect to the internet at home.

What the words mean

Broadband: the way your device can connect to the internet at home.

Device: a laptop, a tablet or a mobile phone.
