Learning to use a computer can be fun. You can play games or look at funny videos.

Here are five ways you can learn some **digital skills**.

Digital skills means knowing how to use a computer or tablet and how to look at the internet.



1. First, you can learn how to **navigate** the screen.

Navigate means moving the cursor around the screen using a mouse or a touchscreen.

Making up **passwords**. Some websites ask you to make up a **username** and password. You can make a password safe by adding a letter, a number and a symbol like % or ^. You can have fun making up passwords and test them on this site:

howsecureismypassword.net



It is important to keep your passwords private. Remembering passwords can be hard. Ask someone you trust to help you remember your passwords.



3. Some websites ask you to fill out an **online form**. An online form asks you questions such as your name and when you were born.

4. If you want to write a story or a letter, you can use a **programme** on the computer called Microsoft Word.
